THE FOUR PILLARS OF STEWARDSHIP

Prayer - Growing in our Relationship with God

Make prayer a part of our lives through individual and communal prayer, public and private prayer

Through prayer we are invited to draw closer to Jesus and to imitate Him in our daily lives.

While Eucharist is central in our spiritual life, other prayer opportunities are made available.

Formation - Continuous Conversion

Educate, form and sustain the faith formation of all ages in the parish, school and school of religion.

Teach by example as we participate in parish life ministries and on parish leadership teams.

Continue conversion to a life of stewardship - sharing what we have generously.

Service - Love in Action

Strive to be servant ministers to the needs of our parish members, the wider community and the Church.

Serve compassionately those who are hurting or in need, lost or alone, or suffering in any way.

Give thanks to God for all the gifts we have received.

Hospitality - Christian Kindness

Extend a warm, hospitable, and loving welcome to all who join us whether in worship, service, study, social time or in times of personal need.

Present a visible sign of Christ's loving kindness in all we do.

PRAYER

Altar Linen Society - Help is also needed laundering the altar cloths, purificators and corporals used at our celebration of the Eucharist. Can also use help with sewing.

Art & Environment– Help create the visual art that is used in the church, following the guidelines prescribed by the Church. Members are needed to assist in all the various aspects such as design skill for creating seasonal environments, sewing abilities (mainly hemming), installing and removing the liturgical environment for each Church season.

Adoration Chapel— Those who spend time each week in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, by making a commitment to a particular hour each week or as a substitute.

Prayer Groups - join any of the following prayer groups.

Early Bird Rosary - Pray the rosary before 6:15 am Mass

Guardian Angel Prayer Chain—Pray at home for those in our parish who ask for our prayers.

Marian Mantle Group - Tuesday evening at 6:15 pm in the cry room. Pray for those no longer practicing their faith.

Our Lady of Fatima Prayer Cell - Friday at 5:30 pm in the Daily Mass Chapel.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Prayer Group—Tuesday at 7:30 pm in the Daily Mass Chapel

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion— Lay ministers who help distribute Holy Communion at Mass. Training is provided. Prerequisite - must be Confirmed.

Lector/Reader– Lay ministers who proclaim the Word of God at parish liturgies on Sundays and special feasts. Training is provided. Must be Confirmed.

Usher– Members of the parish who assist in seating the congregation, passing the collection baskets, directing people during Communion, and handing out bulletins. Must be in high school or older. Training provided.

Altar Server- Young men and women, grade 5 and older, who assist the celebrant at our liturgical celebrations. Training is provided.

Greeter - Members of the parish who greet the people as they come into church.

Music Ministry - Musicians interested in serving at Sunday and Holy Day Masses. Including adult choir, children's choir, cantors, instrumentalists, organists

Media Ministry - A call for those who have the ability and desire to help with sound equipment in the church, as well as the projection system in the church. You do not need to be a professional video technician or professional sound technician, but have the desire to help and learn about the equipment used during Mass.

FORMATION

Prince of Peace Catholic School—grades K-8

Early Education Center—day care, preschool and after school care

School of Religion—religious education for children ages 3—8th grade

Faith Formation Committee - Volunteers interested in developing, planning and organizing a variety of faith formation opportunities for the parish.

Vocation Committee—Volunteers interested in promoting and supporting priestly and religious vocations

Volunteer to lead a Catholic Scripture Study or other adult education-

Participate in Catholic Scripture Study and other adult education- Daytime and evening sessions are available.

Attend a "Christ Renews His Parish" Parish Retreat - This retreat experience, designed specifically for adult members of our parish, is an excellent opportunity to grow closer to the Lord. October and April of every year

Participate in Discovering Christ – 7 week series to encounter Christ in your life

Volunteer in Discovering Christ - help lead, provide meals, babysit

Participate in POPLife—whole parish, all ages, faith formation

Marriage Enrichment - Opportunities for married couples to grow in their faith and to help them in their marriage commitment. You can just participate or you can volunteer to assist with planning and organizing.

Marriage Preparation Lead Couple - Meet with engaged couples and lead them through the Marriage Prep program. To help mentor them as they prepare for the vocation of marriage.

Adult Faith Library - help maintain our Adult Christian Education library.

Assist with RCIA- The RCIA team helps plan classes, prepare refreshments, and assist the catechumens.

RCIA—interest in learning more about the Catholic faith

- ***School of Religion Catechist (grades 1-8) Help the children and youth to grow in the knowledge of our faith. It includes planning and leading weekly lessons and discussions. Aides and substitutes also needed
- ***Children's Church Volunteer (pre-school and kindergarten) Leading young children in growth of their faith through stories, crafts and music on Sunday morning
- ***Totus Tuus— A week-long summertme program for children of our parish. The Totus Tuus Team is a group of college students who travel from parish to parish during the summer to facilitate camps. We need people who can provide housing and/or meals for the team, assist with registration and volunteers during the weeklong camp.
- ***Vacation Bible School Volunteers needed to assist with week —long faith formation program for 4 year olds through 5th grade.
- ***Adult Youth Ministry Core Team— To join with other interested adults in a team approach to ministering to the needs of our high school students as they grow and learn about their faith.
- ***Child Care Help to provide childcare during parish sponsored events/meetings. Especially looking for help during faith formation

SERVICE

Social Concerns Committee - This committee looks at ways our parish can put faith in action through charitable works.

Respect Life Committee - This committee supports the Pastoral Plan for Pro-Life activities.

Blood Drive - We need volunteers to donate blood and help with the blood drive which is held 2 times per year.

St. Mary's Food Kitchen - On the 4th Friday of each month, Prince of Peace serves a hot meal to the poor and disadvantaged in Kansas City. Parish members volunteer to prepare and serve the food.

Bread Runners - Drivers needed to help pick up and deliver bread from local restaurants/grocery stores to Catholic Charities.

Advent Giving Tree - During Advent a tree is placed in the gathering space with ornaments with requests from different agencies. Need help with ornaments, setting up, collecting and delivering to agencies.

Catholic Charities Food Truck– The Catholic Charities Food Donation Truck is here on the 4th weekend of every month. In addition to needing food we need help monitoring the truck before and after Mass and promoting the food drive.

St. Dismus Prison Ministry - Ministers to those incarcerated in the Johnson County Correctional facility.

Scrip - This is a parish wide fundraising effort. Gift cards/certificates to local merchants are available for purchase after Masses each weekend and we receive a percentage of the purchase. Volunteers are needed at each Mass.

Bereavement Ministry - This ministry reaches out to parishioners during a time of loss due to the death of a loved one.

Minister of Communion to the Sick/Homebound: Take Holy Communion to those who are not able to come to Church

Support our Sick Ministry - Phone calls to the sick. Parishioners to call the sick and offer encouragement and support

Support our Sick Ministry - Driving to Mass Parishioners needed to provide rides to Mass for parishioners who are unable to drive.

Meals for the Sick—provide meal support for families struggling due to illness

Prayer Shawls - We welcome anyone who would like to help knit or crochet prayer shawls for parishioners who are sick or homebound.

Garden Club– If you've got a green thumb, you might find a home with our garden club. These parishioners help care for all of the flowerbeds and landscape areas around the parish facilities

Altar/Gathering Space Plants & Flowers - If you have a green thumb, help is needed caring for the flowers/plants in church and gathering space.

Assist with Maintenance & Upkeep of Parish Facilities/Grounds - Do minor repairs and assist with upkeep of parish facilities/grounds. Help is needed with mowing and trimming, and snow removal.

Skilled Labor– We are looking for volunteers to help with various small jobs/maintenance related needs at the parish, ie plumbing, electrical, painting, woodworking, etc. If you have a particular skill/talent of any kind, we can use your help.

Parish Office Support - Assist with various office tasks: prepare bulk mailings, help stuff bulletin inserts, provide phone coverage, run copies, etc. M-F, during parish office hours.

Rectory Meals - provide dinner for our priests

Baptismal Garments—make white garments for the children in our parish being baptized.

Divorce Support Group - Sponsors sessions several times a year to provide support for divorced individuals

Adoptive Family Support Group—This group provides a supportive atmosphere to discuss topics of interest to those in the adoption triad and to be a positive face of adoption in the community. We are open to adoptive parents, and prospective parents, birth parents and older adoptees.

HOSPITALITY

Hospitality Committee - Help coordinate hospitality efforts in the parish

Knights of Columbus– Men of the parish are invited to join the Prince of Peace Council, focusing on strong family values and a sense of service to the mission of the Church and the parish.

POP Moms - Provides opportunities for social involvement with other young families along with opportunities for spiritual growth. Meets 1st Thursday of the month.

Women's Organization – The women of Prince of Peace Parish meet regularly as a large group, as well as in small interest groups and/or in guilds, to support one another, to get to know one another, and to grow in their faith together.

***Catholic Youth Organization (CYO) - The mission of this athletic organization is to help youth grow in the image of Chirst through athletic events. Volunteer coaches are needed.

Catholic Youth Organization (CYO) - CYO sports are for boys and girls grades 3-8.

New member welcome—Assist with registering new parishioners

New Member Social—Assist with a welcoming social for new members

Hospitality Ambassador—assist parishioners and new members on Sunday mornings

Funeral Dinners- Provide food and/or help host a meal for families following the funeral. Will be contacted when the need arises.

***Donuts - Provide donuts and coffee after Sunday morning Masses during the school year. Sponsored by the Knights of Columbus

***Ice Cream Social—help coordinate and serve at annual back to school parish wide ice cream social

***Annual Parish Fall Festival Celebration – Volunteers are needed to help plan and organize the festival, as well as set-up beforehand and clean-up afterwards, work at the games and in the kitchen and dining room.

Friends of St. Anthony - If you are 65 or older: single, widowed, married, working or retired we invite you to join us. We meet once a month for lunch or breakfast

Road Runners are part of Friends of St. Anthony: they take monthly day trips within the city. Participants and drivers needed

Event Greeter - For various other parish events (not including Mass), we need individuals/families who would be willing to act as greeters and extend the spirit of hospitality.

Help with Parish Receptions - At various times throughout the year, the parish hosts receptions in the parish hall Volunteers assist with set-up, serving and clean-up.

Provide Refreshments- Provide cookies, baked goods, etc. for various programs, events and receptions. Will be contacted when the need arises.
