

## Eucharistic Adoration Meeting Q&A from 8/13 and 8/18

1. How do you handle the Blessed Sacrament/monstrance in the event that the Blessed Sacrament should have to be moved or reposed?  
There is no need to move the whole monstrance. The monstrance opens from the back, and the Luna containing the Blessed Sacrament pulls out. This is the only piece to be transferred. Further, with the design of the new chapel, there should never be a need for adorers to repose.
2. In the event of a weather emergency, how do the adorers get out of the chapel, and where do they go?  
There will be more information on an official procedure forthcoming.
3. How can adorers receive a copy of the substitute list?  
There is a supply of substitute lists kept in the chapel in an accordion file available for adorers to take. Further, adorers should look for an email from their respective day captains soon containing a soft copy of the most current substitute list.
4. Where is the calendar showing the current Pray for Priests and Vocations schedule kept?  
An updated calendar is kept in the chapel.
5. Can the substitute list be put out on the website?  
No, this would be a security concern.
6. Can the security code to the chapel be changed?  
After some discussion it was decided to stay with the original code.
7. If an adorer is moving to the new parish, what should he/she do?  
He/she is welcome to continue adoration at Prince of Peace; it will be some time before adoration is available at the new parish.
8. Can lighting be strengthened in the parking lots at night to increase security?  
City ordinances prevent parking lot lights from being used after midnight. It is ok to use handicapped spots during off hours to park as close as possible to the building.
9. It was brought up that should authorities need to be called out, it would be helpful to provide them with what entrance the issue is occurring at.  
All pertinent information will be provided in a frame above the phone in the new chapel.
10. Can we use solar-powered lights along the sidewalks for added nighttime security?  
This will be looked into as a possibility.
11. Should a substitute still be obtained if a 2<sup>nd</sup> person on the hour is known to be there?  
Ideally, yes. There are always emergencies and other circumstances that prevent people from being able to be there when they plan to be.

12. Does a substitute have to be Catholic?

No, just be sure that the person is well-prepared and that there is another Catholic adorer on the same hour.

13. How is the issue of people stopping in for just a few minutes at a time being addressed?

The new chapel's design is such that a "pass-through" will not be feasible as it was before. Fr. Jerry is also talking about this issue in Father's Forum in this Sunday's bulletin.

14. If a funeral is in progress, should the Blessed Sacrament be reposed?

Due to the new chapel's design, this will no longer be necessary.

15. What is the procedure if the person on the next hour does not show up for their hour?

The adorer needs to call the expected adorer to find out what the situation is. If they are unable to make it, and the adorer should stay, if at all possible, until someone else comes. If this is not possible, they need to call their Day Captain. If unable to reach the Day Captain, they need to call one of the coordinators. Once they have spoken to someone *live*, they can leave the chapel. Due to the features in the new chapel, it will not be necessary to repose the Blessed Sacrament.

16. How many hours do not have at least 2 people covering the hour?

As of 8/19/2016, we have 30 hours that do not have at least 2 people covering it. Additionally, the ideal goal is to have 2 *unrelated* people covering the hour. With this in mind, there are actually 9 more hours that could use an additional adorer.
